Are there any real differences between the health care of lesbians and heterosexual women?

Ideally, there shouldn't be. However, research studies have indicated that lesbians sometimes have had negative experiences with their health care providers. Lesbian health has long been a neglected topic in mainstream research. In fact, there have been less than 50 studies focused solely on lesbians, with little said about women of color or lesbians and bisexual women over 40! But we need to change that by identifying what lesbians and bisexual women consider priorities in their health care. In order to assess the current health concerns and health problems of the lesbian and bisexual community in Los Angeles County and the Bay Area, Drs. Susan Cochran and Vickie Mays at UCLA have developed a survey. We have already heard from over 1,100 women from Los Angeles County and the Bay Area. THE SURVEY IS ANONYMOUS.
